33 CORE MEMBERS: People with intellectual or developmental disabilities that live in a L'Arche Erie home or participate in a day program.

70 ASSISTANTS: People without intellectual or developmental disabilities who live with and support Core Members here in Erie.

Mutually transformative relationships form the heart of L'Arche. All of us, whether or not we live with an intellectual disability, desire a sense of belonging. In L'Arche, people of differing intellectual capacities, social origins, religions, and cultures build relationships rooted in trust and vulnerability. By sharing daily life together, community members experience L'Arche as a "University for the Heart," where they learn true friendship and teach one another to love unconditionally.

L'Arche makes it possible for our perceptions regarding disability and vulnerability to be transformed. L'Arche believes everyone has something valuable to contribute, even the most vulnerable. Our weaknesses and vulnerabilities are not to be hidden from others, but welcomed and shared.



FOCUS ON FORMATION

Relationship is the central reality of L'Arche, so it makes sense that L'Arche is often referred to as a "School of the Heart." The heart is the basis of all relationships. If we hope to attend to our relationships with openness, respect, and trust, we need to care for our hearts.

While the situations which restore and sustain the heart might vary from person to person, L'Arche Erie has re-committed to formation as one source for such nourishment. Formation in L'Arche can take many shapes and can span lengths of time as short as 10 minutes and as long as a week. All times of formation have in common: a learning about or grounding in the mission, call, or values of L'Arche; an invitation to reflect on and to share about our own experiences in the light of that learning; and a call to consider how we might integrate the mission, call, or values of L'Arche more fully in what we live together day to day.

In L'Arche Erie, there is a dedicated time for formation within the structure of team meetings and community gatherings. Opportunities to reflect on and integrate the vision of L'Arche are woven into the fabric of conversations and decisions throughout the community. However, with the desire to deepen our understanding of L'Arche and to embody its mission more fully, we have committed to regularly scheduled times of formation. Small groups of assistants and Hearth members pause once every two months for an hour and half to explore some essential aspect of L'Arche and to seek the inspiration and courage to live it into our reality.

We are wrapping up the second full-year cycle of these formation meetings. We hope these opportunities to expand our capacity for relationship and to renew our energy for sharing life together will bear fruit for us individually and collectively. Formation allows for a stepping back from daily life in order to look at things from the perspective for the vision we seek: to share life and friendships in community and to envision and inspire a world that welcomes difference and celebrates the gifts of all people.
